**“Captain Abu Raed”** – Writer/director Amin Matalqa’s feature length, universal story of friendship, inspiration, and heroism and winner the Dramatic World Cinema Audience Award at the 2008 Sundance Film Festival was Jordan’s official selection in the 2008 competition for a Best Foreign Language Film Academy Award. It also competed for Best Actor (Nadim Sawalha) and Best Original Score (Austin Wintory). *dominion3* worked on the 2008 Awards campaign and is currently working on the film’s national theatrical release by NeoClassics Films.

**“Godspeed”** – Filmmaker Robert Saitzyk’s film *Godspeed*, an intense, dramatic thriller set in the lingering light of the Alaskan midnight sun is making its world premiere in competition at CineVegas June 10<sup>th</sup>-15<sup>th</sup> 2009.

**“An Unlikely Weapon”** – Directed by Susan Morgan Cooper and narrated by Kiefer Sutherland, *An Unlikely Weapon* is the chilling story behind a photograph that some say ended the Vietnam War. The film was the winner of ‘Best Documentary’ at the Avignon Film Festival 2008, an ‘Official Selection of Docuweek’ at IDA Film Festival 2008, short list selection of ‘documentary audience favorites’ at the Palm Springs International Film Festival 2009, and Audience Award winner at Santa Cruz Film Festival 2009. *dominion3* is currently working on the film’s national theatrical platform release by Julesworks Releasing, LLC.

**“Heart of Stone”** – Directed by Beth Toni Krivant, *Heart of Stone* is the true story of the challenges of an inner city high school in the Weequahic section of Newark, NJ and the workings of its devoted principal Ron Stone. The film won the Audience Award at Slamdance Film Festival 2009, Best Documentary Feature at Cinequest Film Festival 2009, recipient of the 2009 Kaiser Permanente THRIVE Award during Cinequest, and Best Feature Film at Philadelphia Film Festival 2009.

**“White On Rice”** – Directed by Dave Boyle (“Big Dreams Little Tokyo”) and starring Lynn Chen, James Kyson Lee, Justin Kwong, Pepe Serna, Joy Somanski, and Cathy Shim, *White On Rice* is a comedic story of Jimmy (Hiroshi Watanabe - “Letters from Iwo Jima”), a misguided 40 year old divorcee trying to navigate his way through a new life in America and out of his sister Aiko’s (Japanese Academy Award winner Nae) basement. The film premiered at the 2009 Los Angeles Asian Pacific Film and won Best Screenplay for Boyle and Best Breakthrough Actor for Justin Kwon.

**“On the Line”** (*Auf der Strecke*) by Swiss director Reto Caffi was one of five Oscar® nominees to compete in the 81st Academy Awards in February 2009. Caffi's 30-minute film (his graduation film at the Academy of Media Arts in Cologne) was nominated in the category of "Best Live Action Short Film". dominion3 worked on the 2008 Oscar® campaign.

**“A Very British Gangster”** – Directed by Donal MacIntyre, the film premiered in World Documentary Competition at the 2007 Sundance Film Festival. The film was released by Anywhere Road Film in August 2008 and was officially submitted to the Academy for Best Documentary. dominion3 worked on the 2008 Oscar® campaign.

**“Dragon Hunters”** – Directed by Guillaume Ivanel and Arthur Qwak, *Dragon Hunters* is a fantastic tale of the adventures of two fly-by night dragon hunters Gwizdo (Rob Paulsen) and Lian-Chu (voice of Oscar® Winning Actor Forest Whitaker) whose sole ambition in life is to buy a quiet little farm and hang ten. The Oscar® nominated animated epic follows the adventures of the two hunters-for-hire through a futuristic, medieval world of floating land masses that is terrorized by a widely varying menace of monsters. Its original French title is *Chasseurs de Dragons*. dominion3 worked on the 2008 Oscar® campaign.

**“Barking Water”** – Written & directed by Sterlin Harjo, *Barking Water* is a redemptive road journey that follows the last days of a Choctaw Indian named Frankie, played gracefully by actor Richard Ray Whitman. The film premiered at the 2009 Sundance Film Festival, New Directors/New Films at MoMA 2009 and Native American Film + Video Festival at the Smithsonian 2009.

**“The Last Hurrah”** – Filmmaker Jonathan Stokes debut film *The Last Hurrah* makes its world premiere in competition at this year's Dances With Films Festival. Filmed in one continuous shot, *The Last Hurrah* follows 15 characters for 86 minutes. Set at a graduation party in Los Angeles, an eclectic group of brainy philosophy students, a train-hopping hippie, aspiring prophets, and drug-addled hipsters come together for one wild night.

**“Captain”** – Director Max Cady tackles the question “*how far would you go to push someone to their potential*” in less than 14 minutes in a dark comedy entitled **Captain** – a short competition selection that will make its world premiere at this year's Dances With Films Festival. Written by Nicole Sabrina Stuart (*Bride Wars, After the Fall*) and Jack Sundmacher (*UCLA's James Kirkwood Literary Award nominee*), and produced by live theatre veteran Caitlin R. Campbell, *Captain* is the story of an eccentric teacher who concocts a cruel tale to push one of his students into accessing the deepest part of himself.

**“The World We Want”** – an inspirational documentary film, by independent film producer and former Disney executive Patrick Davidson, it's **World Premiere** at AFI FEST 2008 at the Mann's Chinese Theater in Hollywood went on to win the Audience Award for best documentary. *The World We Want* documents true inspirational stories of teenage activists (ages 11 – 16) throughout the world fighting to improve their communities, their countries and their lives through the Project Citizen curriculum. Shot on location in Bosnia-Herzegovina, Colombia, India, Indonesia, Jordan, Russia, Senegal and the United States, these young students battle for changes that include banning teenage gambling, lowering taxation, creating a town constitution, securing clean drinking water and more. The film documents the young citizens' struggle to convince local and national leaders to enact their ideas while capturing the teenagers' dedication, determination and *empowerment* as they work together to change the world.

**“Yodok Stories”** – Filmmaker Andrzej Fidyk’s compelling film follows 36-year-old North Korean defector, Jung Sung San, who has managed to escape through China to South Korea. Jung organizes a controversial musical theatre play about his experiences as prisoner in the concentration camp Yodok in North Korea. He inspires eight other refugees to recreate the past and despite death threats and many obstacles, the musical becomes a tour de force for this ensemble of refugees. The film screened as part of IDA’s DocuWeek in Los Angeles and New York in order to qualify for an Academy Award nomination.

**“CALLBACK: ‘The Unmaking of BloodStain’”** – Filmmaker Eric M. Wolfson’s feature length film is a hilarious dark comedy that lampoons the chaotic nature of the film industry and the lunacy of day-to-day life in Hollywood. The film received a theatrical release on September 26<sup>th</sup>, 2008 in Los Angeles.

**“Jake’s Closet”** – Written and directed by Shelli Ryan, the film stars Anthony DeMarco (“The Prestige”), Brook Bloome (*CSI Miami*), Sean Bridgers (HBO’s *Deadwood*). The film made its festival debut at the 2007 Dances With Films Festival to rave reviews, and received a DVD release on October 28<sup>th</sup>, 2008.

**“Vicious Circle”** – Written and Directed by Paul Boyd, VICIOUS CIRCLE is a little rock, a little punk and a whole lotta love with a murder mystery twist. It’s a raw, edgy modern day, teenage “Romeo and Juliet” love story, starring Paul Rodriguez Jr. and Emily Rios (“Quinceañera”). The film made its World Premiere at the 2008 HBO New York Latino Film Festival and took home the festival’s top prize “Best Film”.

**“Peter & the Wolf”** – dominion3 worked on the 2008 Oscar® Campaign for the Oscar® nominated Animated Short Film *Peter & the Wolf*. Produced by Hugh Welchman of Breakthru Films and directed by award-winning animator Suzie Templeton, this modern day *Peter & the Wolf* reworks Prokofiev’s popular classic tale giving it some 21st century twists and an environmental theme, while staying true to the original story. Using stop-frame model animation, the story is set to a special new recording by the Philharmonia Orchestra under the direction of Mark Stephenson performing Prokofiev’s original score. The film won the Oscar® for Best Animated Short.

**“Tracing Cowboys”** – Director Jason Wulfsohn’s “*Tracing Cowboys*” is a story about self-deception as well as self-discovery. It’s about honesty but also about betrayal of yourself and the betrayal of others. The film premiered at the 2008 AFI Dallas Film Festival winning Best Cinematography.

**“Reversion”** – Indie Spirit Nominated Director Mia Trachinger’s, “*Reversion*” takes place in a world in which the past, present, and future unfold simultaneously, Eva (Leslie Silva), a woman desperately trying to avoid a destiny in which she kills Marcus (Jason Olive), the man she loves. The film traverses the sprawling landscape of Los Angeles in search of fate, free will, and the nature of morality.

**“The Art Star and the Sudanese Twins”** – First time director Pietra Brett Kelly’s captivating feature length documentary premiered at the 2008 Sundance Film Festival, earning the award for Best Editing. The film follows well-known performance artist Vanessa Beecroft and her attempt to adopt two Sudanese twin boys.

**“North Starr”** – Writer/director Matthew Stanton’s feature length film premiered at the 2008 Sundance Film Festival in Narrative Competition. The film stars Stanton and Jerome Hawkins as they form a friendship that stirs up an old west Texas town that is haunted by its past.

**“Goodbye Baby”** – Writer/director Dan Schechter’s feature length coming of age story made its premiere at the 2008 Slamdance Film Festival. The film stars Christina Evangelista as she struggles to become a stand up comedian in New York City after she graduates high school.

**“The Project”** – Writer/director Ryan Piotrowicz ‘ feature length directorial debut won the Audience Award at the 2008 Slamdance Film Festival. The film stars Michael Stahl David, Jamie Proctor and Nicholas Webber as three documentary filmmakers who set out to make a film about the hardships of inner city Brooklyn.

**“Quantum Hoops: The Caltech Basketball Story”** – Writer/director Rick Greenwald’s award winning feature length documentary, narrated by David Duchovny “Quantum Hoops” follows the 2006 Caltech basketball team as they search for a single win and chronicles the final week of the 2006 Caltech basketball season, currently in the midst of a 21-year losing streak – over 240 consecutive conference losses. What the team lacks in athleticism, it makes up for in academics. Opened in select theatres nationwide.

**“Scanderbeg, Warrior King of Albania”** – Director Nik Gjonaj explores the story of Scanderbeg, one of the most prominent historical figures and a nation hero of Albania, in his first, feature length documentary.

**“Strictly Background”** – Directed by Jason Connell, this award-winning feature length documentary takes a celebratory look at those dedicated men and women who make their living as background talent. The ten extras Jason features in the documentary have been in countless films including *DUDE WHERE’S MY CAR*, *PEARL HARBOR*, *THE SHAWSHANK REDEPMTION*, *THE BENCHWARMERS*, *CHARLIE’S ANGELS*, *MEMOIRS OF A GEISHA*, *APOLLO 13*, *AS GOOD AS IT GETS*, *SPECIES*, *CARRIE*, *MILLION DOLLAR BABY*, *AUSTIN POWERS* and *WEDDING CRASHERS* to name a few. Film made the festival rounds both domestically and internationally to rave reviews.

**“The Naked City”** – Written and directed by David Parkin, this short fictional 1930’s film noir stars JP Brennan, Sandija Zarina, Kevin Flood, Lance Holt, and Mary Prosser. Film made its world premiere at the 2007 LA Shorts Film Festival.

**“Lady Magdalene’s”** – Written and directed by award-winning novelist and journalist J. Neil Schulman, whose original screenplay *Profile in Silver* is one of the best-remembered episodes of CBS’s 1980’s “Twilight Zone” stars Nichelle Nichols, the iconic actress who played “Uhura” on “Star Trek” and Ethan Keogh. The film premiered at Dragon\*Con 2007.

**“Permanent Vacation”** – Written and directed by Scott Peake, and adapted from Geoff Nicholson’s book “*What We Did On Our Holidays*”, this dark comedy stars *Frank Harper*, Charles Shaughnessy, Gina Bellman. The film made its world premiere at the 2007 SoCal Independent Film Festival.

**“Divergence”** – Written and directed by Patrick Donnelly, the film stars Traci Ann Wolfe (“PLAN B”), Jakob Hawkins (USA’s *Housewars*), and Heidi Lipton. The film made its World Premiere at the 2007 Method Fest FF and completed a festival run that included the Staten Island and New Jersey Film Festivals.

**“The Town That Was”** – Directed by Chris Perkel and Georgie Roland this compelling feature film documentary, premiered in competition at the 2007 Los Angeles Film Festival. In 1962, a trash fire ignited a seam of anthracite coal beneath Centralia, Pennsylvania, a once thriving mining town of over 1600 people. Filmed over a period of five years with interviews ranging from former residents to Congressmen, *The Town That Was* is an intimate portrait of John Lokitis, the youngest remaining Centralian, and his quixotic fight to keep alive a hometown that has literally disintegrated under his feet. His unbowed determination and steadfast

refusal to acknowledge defeat reveal a man, a town, a region, and a way of life abandoned and forgotten.

**“Rolling”** – Directed by Billy Saleebey, *“Rolling”* is a turbulent journey that takes a tough yet entertaining look at this unique drug phenomenon. With the pace and style of a documentary, Saleebey captured the essence of the Ecstasy culture, exposing the delicate balance of relationships and responsibilities, while chasing this drug-induced euphoria. Films stars a stellar cast: Sanoe Lake, Garrett Brawith, Clinton Cargile, Rachel Hardisty, Erin Cummings, Joshua Harper, Angie Greenup, Brian William Toth, Albert Rothman, John Paul Cooney, Calico Cooper, Christine Cowden, Brent Horning, Eric Labarr, Jason Seitz, Todd Oeltze, Aaron Perilo, Omi Vaidya, Jason Boegh and Kip Brown.

**“Ya Heard Me?”** – Filmmakers Matt Miller and Stephen Thomas set out to make a feature length, musical documentary about the regional version of hip-hop specific to New Orleans, Louisiana called "Bounce". The film completed its festival run including the San Diego Black FF and The New Orleans Human Rights Film Festival.

**“Sinner”** – Written by Steve Sills, directed by Marc Benardout, the film stars Nick Chinlund, Michael Rodgers, Georgina Cates, and Brad Dourif. The film premiered at the 2007 Garden State Film Festival and completed a festival run including Vail, Newport, Palm Beach, Boston Independent, and more.

**“Just Like the Son”** – Written and directed by Morgan J Freeman (*Hurricane Streets*), the film stars Mark Webber, Antonio Ortiz, Brenden Sexton III, and Rosie Perez. The film screened at the 2007 Method Fest and Newport Beach Film Festivals.

**"Dating Games People Play"** – Written, directed and starring Stefan Marc, this romantic comedy has been described as 'Swingers' meets 'American Pie.' The film stars Austin Peck ("Days of Our Lives") and Leslie Bega ("Sopranos", "CSI"), and had a limited theatrical release in March 2007.

**“WEAPONS”** – Written and directed by Adam Bhala Lough (“Bomb the System”), the film stars Paul Dano, Nick Cannon, and Mark Webber. The film premiered in competition and was sold at the 2007 Sundance Film Festival.

**“Premium”** – Directed by Pete Chatmon, the film stars Hill Harper, Zoe Saldana, and Dorian Missick. The film had its limited theatrical release in Georgia, North Carolina and Virginia in February 2007 followed by a national DVD rollout.

**“Hysteria”** – Written by Tim Tori, directed by Frank Lyn, and produced by former LA LAKERS Rick Fox’s 1744 Entertainment, the film stars Cheyenne Scott, Emmanuelle Vaugier, Vince Vieluf, and Laura Allen. The film was completed in summer 2007.

**“Jewish American Princess”** – Directed by Jackie and Ian Davis, this documentary made its world premiere at the 2007 Delray Beach FF and won the Audience Award.

**“Big Dreams Little Tokyo”** – Written and directed by David Boyle the film stars Jayson Watabe, Rachel Morihira ("Rectuma", "Finding Madison"), Drew Knight, Pepe Serna ("Scarface", "The Black Dahlia"), Michael Yama ("Down and Out in Beverly Hills", "Click"), and James Kyson Lee (NBC's "Heroes", "Collateral", "Big Fish"). Film premiered at the 2006 AFI Film Festival in Los Angeles and was part of the festival's 20/20 series.

**“Hollywood”** – Written and Directed by Rick Rose, the film stars Rick Rose (“Pearl Harbor”), Katherine Azarmi (“Pranksters”), Liz Carey (“40 Year Old Virgin”), and Natalie Compagno. The film made its limited theatrical release on October 27, 2007 in Los Angeles.

**“Swedish Auto”** – Written and directed by Derek Seig, the film stars Lukas Hass, January Jones and Brianne Davis. Film made its world premiere at the 2006 Los Angeles Film Festival.

**“Pope Dreams”** – Directed and written by Patrick Hogan, film stars Phillip Vaden, Stephen Tobolowsky, and Julie Hagerty. The film received the Grand Jury Prize at the Atlanta International Film Festival, and completed its festival run winning prizes in the Atlanta, Phoenix, Stoneybrook, USA Film Festivals and more.

**“The LA Riot Spectacular”** – Directed by award-winning music video director Marc Klasfeld film stars Emilio Estevez, Charles Dutton, TK Carter, and narrated by Snoop Dogg.

**“SP!T”** – A hair-raising and emotionally dazzling feature length spoken word documentary, directed by Rotimi Rainwater that explores the world of Slam Poetry, focusing on four performance artists from Los Angeles and New York as they battle their way to stardom at the National Poetry Slam Competition. Narrated by Rosario Dawson, Mums and Abiodun, we meet key figures from the aggressive Hollywood slam scene, including Def Poetry Jam producer Russell Simmons and the charismatic Shihan, style-setter and coach of Los Angeles’ own Da Poetry Lounge. “SP!T” has screened at festivals across the country and will be distributed theatrically late 2006.

**“Wannabe”** – Directed by Richard Keith and stars Steve Williams (Craig Young), the film completed its festival rounds and received the Audience Award at the 2006 Dances With Films.

**“Straight into Darkness”** – Written and directed by Jeff Burr, the film premiered at film festivals around the world including Milan International Film Festival, South By Southwest, Avanca International Film Festival and Atlanta Film Festival. It was released nationwide on DVD in June of 2006.

**“Coffee Date”** – Written and directed by Stewart Wade, “Coffee Date” examines the life of recently divorced, mid-30's Todd (Jonathan Bray) whose life spins out of control when an unexpected friendship with a gay man (Wilson Cruz) causes everyone in his life to start thinking that he too is gay. One complication leads to another when Mom (Sally Kirkland), brother (Jonathan Silverman), out and proud gay co-worker Clayton (Stuart) and sexy co-worker Melissa (Deborah Gibson) enter the fray. *Coffee Date* screened at festivals nationwide and was released in fall of 2006.

**“Behind the Smile”** – Written and directed by and stars Damon Wayans. The film also stars Marlon Wayans, Terry Crews with supporting roles from James Belushi, Camryn Manheim and Shakara Ledard. Gilm features a number of comedian cameos including Jim Carey, Bob Saget, and more. Produced by Annice Parker and Clark Peterson (MONSTER), the film is about a young comic who leaves Cleveland for Hollywood to pursue his dream of stardom and becomes entangled in the city's seductive lifestyle. *Behind the Smile* made its world premiere at the HBO Aspen Comedy Film Festival March 2006.

**“Journey From the Fall”** – Written and directed by Ham Tran, *Journey From the Fall* tells the EPIC story of a family who is painfully torn apart by the war, forced to emigrate across a dangerous sea, reunified and struggling to survive in America. Film stars Kieu Chinh (Joy Luck Club, Green Dragon) and Long Nguyen (Heaven and Earth, Green Dragon). It premiered at the 2006 Sundance Film Festival in Spectrum.

**“Neo Ned”** – Directed by Van Fischer film stars Jeremy Renner, Gabrielle Union, Ethan Suplee, Cary Elwes and Sally Kirkland. Premiered at the Tribeca Film Festival last year and at the 2006 Slamdance Film Festival. Film won an audience award for best feature screening out of competition.

**“Love is the Drug”** – An Alpine Pictures Film. Directed by Elliott Lester and written by Wesly Strick, the film stars John Patrick Amedori, Lizzy Caplan, Jonathan Trent, and Jenny Wade. Film made its world premiere at the Slamdance Film Festival 2006 to rave reviews.

**“Running Out of Time in Hollywood”** – Directed by Catherine Carlen and Jim Edwards, film stars Carlen, Lela Rochon, John Diehl, Kevin Kelly, Michael Harris, Billy Wirth, Judy Dixon and Maggie Wagner. Film made its world premiere in March at the Delray International Film Festival.

**“Penny Dreadful”** – Written and directed by Richard Brandes film stars Mimi Rogers and Rachel Miner. Early buzz is that Penny Dreadful is one of scariest horror films ever!

**“JAM”** – Written and Directed by Craig Serling, JAM is an ensemble feature film that unfolds during a sweltering Father's Day on a two-lane rural highway. Christopher Amitrano, David DeLuise, Amanda Detmer, William Forsythe, Tess Harper, Marianne Jean-Baptiste, Gina Torres and Jonathan Silver are among the cast of eight sets of unrelated travelers in this emotionally charged film.

**“Whiskey School”** – Directed by Peter Masterson and written by Jo Ann Tedesco, film stars Olympia Dukakis, Carlin Glynn Lainie Kazan, Mary Stuart Masterson and Gary Swanson. A 'Drama a' Clef' based upon the actual intervention of a somewhat infamous American playwright the film is an exploration of the frustrating and frightening mental roller-coaster ride an alcoholic faces in his battle against the pain, shame and actual hostility which his disorder wreaks.

**"The Talent Given Us"** – Written and directed by Andrew Wagner, film stars Allen Wagner, Judy Wagner, Emily Wagner, Maggie Wagner, Judy Dixon and Billy Wirth. Film won top Jury Award at 2004 CineVegas Film Festival and The Audience Award at 2004 Dances With Films Festival. Screened at the 2005 Sundance Film Festival in American Spectrum. Film opened nationally in select theatres.

**“Walking on the Sky”** was written and directed by and stars Carl T. Evans. dominion3 handled the LA/NY press campaign, which is distributed by Echelon Entertainment. The film features amazing performances by an ensemble cast - Randal Batinkoff ("The Peacemaker, The Player"), Chris Henry Coffey ("Thirteen Days") Nicole Fonarow ("All My Children") and Kristen Marie Holly ("Mona Lisa Smile"). It is an emotionally charged portrait of a group of six friends who come together in despair following the death of one of their own. Over a twenty-four hour period everything they once believed will be questioned, forcing them to search for answers within themselves about love, friendship, and true happiness.
